Good afternoon everyone,

Another lovely week had by all, I've seen some fantastic learning going on in the classes and the Germoe group out in Romania are having a wonderful time and representing our federation outstandingly. Just a few reminders this week:

Harvest Festival: Our children have been preparing some poetry and songs for you so please do come along to support them. We will be taking donations of gifts, food etc to be auctioned on the day. Please could you start to bring those into the office on Monday morning. We will present the goods and you can bid for them, you can either pay by cash on the day or bring the cash to the office the following morning. Proceeds will be split equally between the school and the food bank.

Free school meals: Although reception, year one and year two receive universal free school meals, this doesn't entitle them to other subsidies such as school trips, extra support from DFE funding unless they are recognised as receiving free school meals. You will need to sign up for free school meals on the Cornwall Council website in order for us to receive extra funding for them. Please do this as the school budgets are very tight this year due to increased costs and it would help us a great deal. If you need any help in signing up for free school meals just ask Linda or Anita.

Punctuality: We have noticed that some children are still coming to school late. This not only affects their own learning and wellbeing but it affects the learning of the other children in the class. Reception/year1/year 2 start at 0900 and Years 3,4,5,6 start at 0845. Please make sure vour child arrives on time. It also has a knock on effect for the whole school and gives us a bad rating on Attendance 2.00pm and Punctuality with Ofsted. If you are having any difficulties in getting your child to school on time then please don't hesitate to ask us for help.
